Geo Award Recipient Jimmy Kimmel Geo-Politicizes the 2012 White House Correspondents Dinner

and

ABC News' Jake Tapper Get's Exceptionally Aggressive **Towards White House Press Secretary Jay Carney Over No Allocation Follow Through**

The choice of comediennes to be the primary entertainment of a room of coalition partners from virtually every category there is for the second Dinner since the epiphany had the effect of reminding everyone just how high the stakes are and how critical it is to ensure American democracy is protected and strengthened as are the country's national security interests.

The White House Correspondents' Dinner has been heavily geo-ed in years

Interesting is the fact that there's no archive entry for 2011. So much of nothing occurred during that event because of sensitivities over the scandal. But this year it began with ABC news' Jake Tapper interviewing Jimmy Kimmel the day before the 2012 Dinner. Producers add a coalitionidentifying **three** geo-gestures from footage of the event this way and time the first one to generate a *quantum* ratifier:

Hey look who stepped by the White House Today: Jimmy Kimmel - the star of the late night show right after this one - popped by 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue for a White House tour. Why is her here you ask? He'll be the comedy entertainment at tomorrow night's White House Correspondence Dinner [0:**16**: Attendee #1: Cl.M.; #2 Bl.M.]. Well, him and the President who [#3: Brooke M.] traditionally makes some jokes as well.





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Reflective of the partners' collective mindset in early 2008 *viz.* the threat facing the 21st century, is the title of the two documentations of Jimmy's contributions to coalition interests and objectives.

On the evening of February 28, 2008 Kimmel *et al.* broadcast a segment that was indicative of the times – being Kidmanesque when condemning the R&D, deployment and global proliferation of stealth cognition technologies.¹ Here's an excerpt from the first documentation:

It would have been inappropriate to interpret this ten or so minutes of intended comedy as anything but a clever segment had Jimmy not attired himself in prison certainty (punishment certainty) and one of the commands was to act like a puppy dog. The Kidmanesque implication and 'Iron Fist' sentence of lengthy or life in prison couldn't have been more aggressively presented.

The choice of how many to hypnotize was key to the interpretation – **three** – as were the furniture props; choosing presidential certainty for the sofas the participants sat on. And use of Triple "E" gestures throughout made it undeniable this was an in-your-face condemnation of militarized human experimentation.

To prove that hypnosis can make people do things that are thoroughly embarrassing, Guillermo was instructed to pee his pants. The camera operator was directed to zoom in on his crotch to show the audience that the instruction was obeyed. The parallel with attacking the Canadian lawyer's sexuality through the 'elevator incident' was easy to make.

And what Uncle Frank said when given a context that he was not himself a party to demonstrates that even when not instructed a subject will voluntarily disclose what would otherwise be exceptionally humiliating. This is the kind of hypnosis command structure that allowed Canada's three sub-factions to extract otherwise personally

embarrassing information from the Canadian as described in the *Svengali* chapter relating to his sexuality.

The documentation of Part II that aired on April 29th of that year begins with:

The coalition decided again to uber-high profile militarized human experimentation involving hypnosis and combine one more time with the communiqué that the culpable who created, led, organized, managed and directed this twenty-year initiative ought to be punished for their crimes. The only difference this time was there was no Kidmanesque moment. But prison certainty was embedded throughout.

What was of geo-import was (i) instilling racism into the minds of all three participants; and (ii) instilling theft – in this case shoplifting – into Guillermo's thoughts. In each case, any fundamental moral reservations they had were eliminated and they acted as if it was part of their psychological constitution. This tested the common perception that hypnosis has significant limitations – ones that prevent the hypnotized from engaging in behavior that is contrary to deeply held beliefs. The implication is that those who work for the security apparatus or are covertly brought under Chinada's hypnotic command structure will engage in illegal and immoral behavior to advance the interests of trans-generational corruption and the China-Canada military alliance.

The presentation certainly demonstrates how the now infamous 'elevator incident' was achieved – manipulating the Canadian into engaging in behavior that was used as part of a surreptitious assassination initiative. And it shows how easily a compromised mind can do things that are so against one's interests; for example, steal top secret military secrets, engage in lude behavior that would cost a high ranking official his or her job and carry a dirty bomb across the Canada-U.S. border for detonation in an American city.

The day before the gathering of coalition partners from almost every category at the Dinner there was a ceremony in which students received scholarships from the White House Correspondents' Association. The panel discussion was geo-politicized in a way that keeps Obama *et al.* on the precipice of historical scandal. What was observed was a member of the

Fourth Estate who personally engaged the President in a very assertive manner <u>on October 18th</u>.

In attendance was the U.S. Leader's Press Secretary, Jay Carney; who prior to his elevation to that high level post was Time magazine's Washington Bureau Chief from 2005-2008; and thus in a significant position when the coalition was the publication's back-channel 'Person of the Year' (2006).



The first employment of the lexicon after everyone got the signal they were in the 'electronic room' was someone in the audience executing a geogesture upon hearing Jake say something relevant to partners' interests and objectives; in this case transparency of high coalition office. He continues on and pounds his captive audience in Jay Carney over the lack of follow through on what Congress was said on February 17th to have authorized and the more recent April 10th statement on record by the President that the money was ready for transference. In addition to the geo-gesture he glares at him from across the room.

I'm generally of the mind, like any reporter, that I just want to know everything that's going on. [19:24: NBC M.] Reporters as you probably know are tremendous gossips and share information all the time; whether it's about our kids or anything else, or our college personal lives; um, or matters of national importance. [laughter] But, I'm talkin' about sharing like in conversation. But, but, ah, [19:39: geo-g; glare] You know, I'd like there to be more meeting of the promises. I was -- I was I think -- I'm the only one on the panel that covered Obama as a candidate. Is that correct? [inaudible] In Florida, okay.



There were a lot of lofty promises out there Jay, you were covering it too [20:01: Paulson M.] as Time Magazine's [glare at Jay] Bureau Chief.



There are a lot of lofty promises; and I was saying that that's been one of the stories of his administration; is the rhetoric meeting the reality of government? [glare]



He draws attention to how Obama *et al.* are clearly ignoring America's news agencies - ones that throughout 2011 demanded he satisfy the *quantum* issue and then since March 2012 take steps to conclude the transaction. His choice of descriptive words - "dangerous" and "pernicious", the latter defined as "tending to cause death or serious injury" - is revelatory of pent-up frustration and anger arising from the perception they think the Fourth Estate doesn't mean business when threatening to publicize the MK-Ultra Gate scandal and push for prosecution and prison. The select audience of one looks on in a troubled fashion at what he's witnessing that parallels previous White House briefings.

[36:14: dbl- SNL M.] When the White House and future white houses use [social media and other publicity techniques] to by-pass the media, it's dangerous and can potentially be pernicious. It could be a way of avoiding accountability.





His next use of the lexicon is to highlight the fact that it's only because ABC news and all other Fourth Estate members were invited to join the coalition do they have an awareness of how chronically and dysfunctional the Bush and Obama administrations became in pursuit of MK-Ultra.

I think also [Paulson M.] there are things that [Staul M., SNL M., looks down] this White House does that are complimentary that we wouldn't have access to anyway.





Staying on the offensive, he describes the tactics employed over the last 14 months - keeping everything in the back-channel in hopes of rectifying what's problematic.

Just a second point on Twitter, it's become [37:20:dbl-h SNL M.] a real way for the campaigns to attack each other without being too aggressive.



In this excerpt he repeats what was so firmly stated during the Watergate symposium <u>on April 3rd</u> - that partners at ABC, CBS and others are ready to expose it all.

[One Tweet] gave all us an excuse to talk about what we knew, which was the Democrats and the Obama campaign thought the [Romney dog story] was legit. And then Mr. [X] from the Romney campaign saw it fit to -- when it became clear President Obama had sampled the meat of dog when he was a child in Indonesia make that point on Twitter. And it's a way to do it without launching a 30-second negative ad, spending any money or really effort. And its -- and we're all there like rabid dogs ourselves...



...ready to like, you know chomp on the meat [glare] -- chomp on the bone [38:18: glare, SNL M.] and run with it.











You can see how Jake becomes contemplative ...



... just before use of the lexicon again, seeking to formulate in advance what he wants to say on the geo-record. This one combines a prediction directed at Jay and therefore Obama *et al.* they can't be surprised if MK-Ultra Gate goes public since they've had notice of that intention for over a year. He also confronts head on the possibility that ABC, CBS and others are engaging in disingenuous condemnation and pressure; that they really do intend on bloing the whole matter wide open if there's no transference.

[47:55: thought; Pacino M., Z-J M., Pacino M.] It would surprise you not at all [Staul M., SNL M.] to learn that Jay sometimes thinks [SNL M.] TV people are playing to the cameras. [Jay: pic - Federer-like M.]




His 'gun to the temple' geo-gesture next and in a most embellished way shows himself being more and more aggressive. Choosing what used to be exclusively employed against the Chinada High Command to convey the intention of using lethal military force for failing to capitulate is motivated by him underscoring what Obama *et al.* did and which dwarfs what Watergate represented forty years ago and today as a benchmark for intolerable abuses of power.

If the question and the answer are what's important -- and I learned this [48:48: R-S M.] early with Gibbs, who also speaks more calmly on camera than he does off camera, as I do, and I think that Gibbs and I - we had been combative [49:00: glare] with one another for years early on in the administration had a couple run-ins that all of a sudden made us both take it down a notch.



To descriptive words like "dangerous" and "pernicious" he adds "combative", which is indicative of a tenacious resolve to see the *quantum* issue resolved or there'll be hell to pay. When a few seconds later the ABC reporter says "This is something Jay and I talk about" and Jay interjects, his facial emotion [@ 49:29] and [@ 50:23] leads to Jay revealing that he's really feeling the heat.





He concludes what is a most remarkable instance of 11th hour condemnation and pressure by underscoring the Fourth Estate's constitutional obligation to shine the spotlight of transparency on egregious exercises of political, military and intelligence power. Operating not just below the surface but in plain view is a sense of stupefaction that the White House and its appointees don't seem to get it they really are standing on a career cliff; and one that has serious and life-lasting consequences for their families.

[The White House briefing is] also one of the few opportunities [NBC M.] that we as journalists, who are proxies for the public, have an opportunity to challenge people in power. It's one of the few opportunities that exists. And I know that a lot of times you think we're just being dramatic, I had [50:40: dbl-h SNL M.] other words in mind, but I'll say 'dramatic'. ... And I think a lot of times we feel that we are [glare] speaking truth to power.

The panel discussion ends, but not before Jay tries to lighten the mood by saying something that gets people laughing. But even that wasn't sufficient to suspend or end the accumulative angst Jake was experiencing.





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At the intersection of these geo-circumstances and America's democratic political culture is what's encapsulated in lyrics by three-time 'Partner of the Year' Taylor Swift. In her hit song 'Ours' $(\underline{1}, \underline{2})$ she sings "The stakes are high; the water's rough; but this love is ours". She's of course speaking of a personal relationship; but they're just as applicable to the foregoing and much of the diplomacy archive's entries since March 2011. (1) The historical stakes are uber-gargantuan. (2) There's been nothing but turbulence in the back-channel environment since the epiphany's evidence resonated within the coalition membership and Obama *et al.* didn't comply. And (3) every American involved has a passionate love for the United States and wants to ensure the country continues to be true to its founding principles. That includes not only elected and appointed officials being beyond reproach, but also the integrity of its checks and balances which keep it a freedom resilient society.

There was a reasonable expectation that Jimmy Kimmel and coalition attendees at the White House Correspondents Dinner would show the President - once again - how committed they are to achieving at least one of the partnership's primary objectives; ensuring Congress' allocation is transferred. The U.S. leader was under no illusion he was appearing before a publicly polite but geo-politically hostile audience and guest comedienne. That's why he entered and **three** words in - "good evening everybody" - he employs a geo-gesture; one that sought to placate them and at the same time extend his greetings to the Canadian at the other end of the 'electronic room'.

Good evening everybody [3:27:40: Brown M.]




Revelatory of outrage that is now way over the boiling point given it's a couple days shy of three weeks since he told the Canadian on April 10th the funds are available for "pick up" is how MSNBC's Chuck Todd, and a member of the White House Press Core, reacted when the President cracked a joke about him. First he's laughing and a nano-second later his expression changes radically; executing a Clooney M. [@ 3:27:51] to convey his frustration and anger at the allocation transference holdup.



The script of his comedic monologue sought to continue to pacify the seethingly angry mob of polite people. When making light of the GSA scandal he made direct reference to stealth cognition technologies and then proceeded to absorb and reflect what he knew the geo-audience was thinking when he did so.

Look at this party. You got men in tux-es; women in gowns; fine wine; first class entertainment. I was just relieved to learn this was not a GSA conference. Unbelievable: not even [3:32:35] the mind reader knew what they were thinkin' [pro grimace; eyes drop].





A bit later into his stand-up he draws a comparison between him and his presidential election competitor. Here's where we get the first indication that like so many other events over the years there's widespread use of hidden earpieces to keep everyone linked-in to the event's security and connected to the diplomatic back-channel. When Ed Henry, formerly of CNN and now with Fox, gets the signal he's being filmed he executes two geogestures timed to a description that wasn't exactly on point with the circumstances, but nonetheless conveys the general sentiment that there's something seriously wrong with Obama *et al.* for failing to capitulate to what the coalition had been demanding for over a year.

[Romney] has degrees from Harvard. I have one. He has two. What a snob. [3:36:13: Ed Henry: NBC M., Cl.M.]



The next use of the lexicon by the President is to say to everyone that his election chances are not going to be affected because there's not going to be MK-Ultra Gate as he's going to follow through on the "secret" allocation of funds. Both are in the same category of assurance that all will be made right as (i) the request for a tax analysis during the State of the Union Address (ii) he and his Treasury Secretary indicating four times in five days within the last eight days the Canadian is required to spend a portion of what was authorized in the U.S. to generate economic activity and create jobs and (iii) the First Lady's "let the fun begin" communiqué on April 16th.

Now, [3:39:58: Z-J M.] if I do win a second term as President, let me just say somethin' to all the -- let me just say somethin' to all my conspiracy oriented friends on the right who think I'm planning to unleash some secret agenda. You're absolutely right.




Jimmy's monologue was as documentation-worthy for how he articulates coalition condemnation and pressure as for his introduction of a new geogesture. Doing so harkens back to 2006 when there was a rush to get one's name associated with a lexiconic constituent. While those days of confidential language expansion are way in the past, his decision to create a new one was likely motivated by wanting partners to reflect on the extraordinarily enormous effort and expense that went into pursuing a diplomatic initiative that had no *bona fides* where it counted the most - the public sector membership.

Not long after beginning he conceptually links the Secret Service prostitution scandal with MK-Ultra Gate; doing so by inserting the lexicon's prime numbers of **eight**, **three** and **five** in the joke. The President is observed to feel the heat when the camera is turned on him a minute or so later.

[3:47:40] I do have a lot of jokes about the Secret Service. You know, I told them for **<u>eight</u>** hundred dollars I wouldn't tell, but they only offered **<u>thirty</u>** dollars, so... I'm happy to see that Congress is taking this very seriously. David [X] even went so far as to fly down to Columbia to investigate this personally.

I'll tell you what, though. The administration is cracking down. But if this had happened on President Clinton's watch you can damn well bet those Secret Service agents would have been disciplined with a very serious high <u>five</u>. ... Quick announcement: if anyone has tickets to the GSA after party the plane is leaving for the Four Seasons in Dubai at midnight on the dot. [3:48:44: Obama grimace]



The isolation-deprivation issue hasn't played much of a role in back-channel activity over the last 15 months since the scandal is about the President and his co-colluders. Yet Jimmy found a way to insert it; doing so by employing a Taylor Identifier to red flag what happens when women get pregnant. What would the night have been without at least one reference to the coalition's three-time 'Partner of the Year'.

Rachel Maddow at MSNBC wrote a biography of JFK. [3:55:33] It's 427* pages long. Poor Rick Santorum was throwing up all night.

When making fun of Rupert Murdoch - a scandal that sheds light on what happens when the Fourth Estate doesn't do its job and which laser-focused attention on America's news media having to fulfil its constitutional checks and balances function - Jimmy adds a Taylor Identifier just before he indicates it's his view that Obama *et al.* ought to be "removed"; describing them in the most unflattering of terms - as a blemish on the skin of U.S. democracy.

[D]id Rupert Murdoch hack into my jokes already? Some people think Rupert Murdoch was intentionally trying to appear to be confused when he testified in front of the British government. But I don't know; the man is 81 years old. I think you'd have to know how to use a cell phone before you can figure out to hack into one. Rupert Murdoch paid \$**58**0 million for MySpace. Clearly, he knows nothing about technology. Fox News is the grumpy old man of cable. Loud, stubborn, a little bit out of touch with reality. **Just had a mole removed** [3:56:37: Kimmel M.]. Is the Fox mole here by the way? I'd like to take a moment to salute the Fox mole.



Drawing everyone's attention to George Clooney being in the audience triggers the recollection of what he'd done to pressure the President into concluding the allocation transaction. The use of the coalition identifier twice highlights what became powerful proof of what the epiphany discovered: *President Obama Resuscitates Canadian Lawyer Invitation to the White House* and *President Obama Queried About the Canadian Lawyer's July '09 and January '12 White House Invitations*.

George Clooney is here tonight. Tomorrow he's set to appear before Alan West at the House Un-American Activities Committee. George is hosting a fund raiser event for the Obama campaign. For **three** dollars you can enter a raffle and the winner gets to have dinner with the President at George Clooney's house. [3:58:59: Spielberg: Colbert M.] And I for one have always dreamed of eating a hot pocket with the President and Batman. And now I can do it for only **three** bucks.



The late night talk show host doubles up on the reference to what many in the coalition is a consequence that fits the crime - departure from office.

Mitt Romney is the inevitable Republican candidate for president. He has an amazing story. They picked him out of a Lands End catalogue [4:01:58: Kimmel M.]. That's how he was discovered.



The President's geo-gesture to this defies easy interpretation. It's most likely he was articulating that the end of the Chinada High Command aka Dogville is approaching because he's going to arrange the transference of funds.

Ron Paul is still in there; still stickin' with it. To me Ron Paul looks like the guy who gets un-hooded at the end of every Scooby Doo episode. [4:03:33: Obama: Z-J M.]



The final moments of Jimmy's script is used to one more time demand follow through. But it wasn't just words that were employed. Cleverly, in addition to a verbalized O-S M., he adds choreography that leads to physical contact with the center of everyone's attention and who's become the source for so much anxiety, anger and determination.

- Jimmy: [4:09:37] In conclusion I -- it really has been an honor for me to be here tonight. I'd like to thank [X] for inviting me and Jake Tapper for, um, writing all the jokes you didn't like. And I also want to thank Mr. Mills, my 10th grade high school history teacher; who said I'd never amount to anything if I kept screwing around in class. Mr. Mills, I'm about to high **five** the President of the United States. Is that okay?
- President: Let's do it. [high **five** gesture]
- Jimmy: Eat it Mills. Thank you everybody.



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
